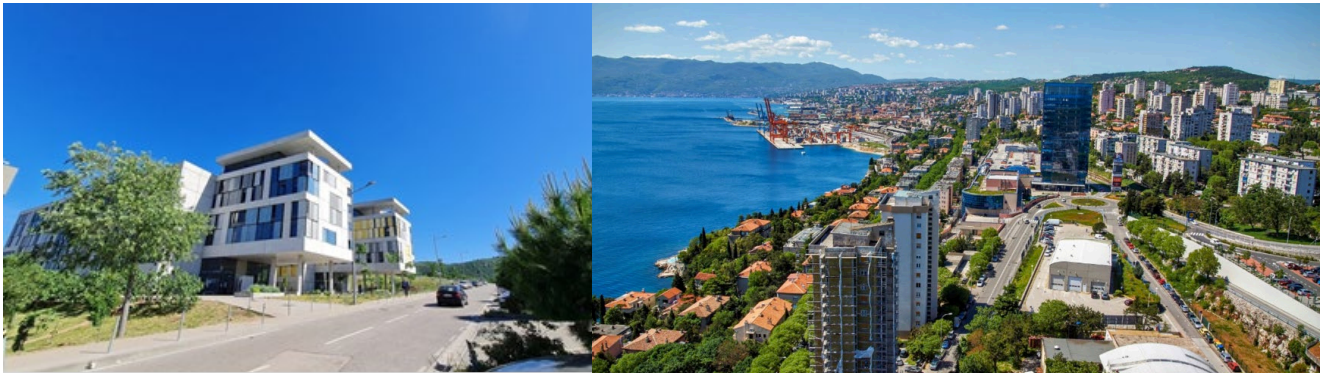

On the WIPO summer school

In cooperation with the [State Intellectual Property Office](#) and the [University of Rijeka](#), the Academy of the World Intellectual Property Organization ([WIPO Worldwide Academy](#)) with headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland, organizes the tenth in a row international [Summer School on Intellectual Property](#) in Croatia for two weeks, **from 31 August until 11 September 2026**.

The Summer School offers an invaluable educational program that covers the entire field of intellectual property.

There are 30 places available for attending Summer School in Rijeka. Selected participants will be notified one week after the [application deadline](#).

The aim of the Summer School is to provide an opportunity for senior students and young professionals to gain more knowledge about intellectual property and to understand its value as a driver of economic, social, cultural and technological development, and to learn more about WIPO's role in global intellectual property management.

Who can apply for the Summer School?

The Summer School is open to graduate and postgraduate students from all faculties, as well as young professionals from all fields.

Language

English.

Registration fee

The registration fee is paid to the State Intellectual Property Office upon receipt of the notification of admission to the school.

For students and young professionals from **developing countries and countries in transition** with residence in these countries, the registration fees are:

students: US\$ 200
young professionals: US\$ 300

For students and young professionals from **developed countries**, the registration fees are:

students: US\$ 400
young professionals: US\$ 500

Registration fee payment: from 8 June, 2026 to 10 July, 2026

Distance learning

Before attending the Summer School, selected candidates will have to successfully pass the General [*General Course on Intellectual Property \(DL-101\)*](#) of the World Intellectual Property Organization Academy, which will be held specifically for them via the distance learning system (Internet). The dates for this course will be announced after the preliminary selection of candidates for the Summer School.

Program

The Summer School program consists of lectures by prominent experts in the field of intellectual property from WIPO and other institutions. The program also includes case studies and discussions on selected topics in the field of intellectual property. WIPO will award a Certificate of Participation to all those who successfully meet the program requirements.

To apply, you must submit

- a short CV; and
- a letter of motivation (in which you state the reasons why you want to participate in the Summer School); and
- what you expect from the program.
